#### Comments

Exceptions to the academic calendar relating to the beginning and end of exams and deliberation sessions are the responsibility of the faculties, in consultation with other relevant faculties. These exceptions will be approved by faculty bodies no later than 15 November for the January session and 1 May for the June and September sessions. The ADEF director will be informed of these decisions. (CEFO 20/02/2012)

Faculties are authorised to organise degree deliberations and proclamations 1) beyond the June exam session and 2) beyond the September exam session, so that there are more days to conduct all the exams for each session. (CEFO 12/11/2015)

The end dates of deliberations are deadlines. Faculties can finish their deliberations sooner. (CEFO 17/12/2015)

In BAC1, a particular week called SMART (a French acronym that roughly translates as 'Multisite Week for Success and Transition Assistance') is organised in the first term. This week is an integral part of the first-year bachelor's program and allows for the organisation of educational tests, remedial activities, alternative activities, personal or group work, make-up classes, etc. This week can also be organized in other years of study, depending on the choice of the faculty.

Faculties are authorised to make up, during the second term, classes that fall on holidays or event days (e.g. University Celebration Day, honorary doctorate ceremony, 1 May, Pentecost, etc.). (CEFO19/12/2013)
